To talk: From Swarthmore, drive west on Baltimore Pike to Smedley Park entrance (right on Papermill Rd.), located just before reaching I-476 / Blue Route. Take first left to Delaware County Cooperative Extension Education Center

To Guided Walk: From Smedley Park, drive west on Baltimore Pike, then north on Providence Road. (Be sure to take left fork just past Rose Tree Park to STAY on Providence Road.) Turn left on Gradyville Road, and left at the second Ridley Creek State Park entrance. Make the first left, just past the stables and the mansion that serves as Park Headquarters. Follow signs to Picnic Area # 9. Restrooms are available at Parking Area.
